

Graduate Student Program at ED-MEDIA 2010 Conference



The Association for the Advancement of Computing in Education (AACE) is proud to offer a new learning opportunity for graduate students attending the 2010 ED-MEDIA conference, held in Toronto. The program will include a series of workshops/presentations specifically designed to meet the needs of graduate students from diverse disciplines. The presentations have been carefully selected to complement graduate studies in a variety of disciplines with emphases on research skills and new technologies. Conference presenters are specialists in the areas including several ED-MEDIA Program Committee members.

The program consists of a keynote on **Socially Responsible Educational Technology Research** by Emeritus Professor Thomas Reeves, and 12 presentations and workshops dealing with topics like:

- Completing your thesis on time: Motivation and monitoring
- Web 2.0 technologies in higher education
- Ethics of research and informed consent
- Introduction to theory, such as Connectivism and Constructivism
- Web 2.0 Personal Learning Environments (PLE 2.0): From dreams to reality?
- Systemic reviews: strategies for success

The program will also appeal to supervisors, advisors, early career researchers and others interested in the conduct of research in educational technology fields.

AACE and ED-MEDIA offer this program as a service to graduate students with the hope that their home institutions would consider structuring a readings course or independent study that included attendance at these and other ED-MEDIA sessions as part of the course requirements.
